1- Art Deco Casablanca

Casablanca is a laboratory city, which represents an experimentation area of several architects and where the encounter of both the Art deco and the Arab-Moorish art originated a unique and rare architecture. A quick room in the Center of the city: Boulevard Mohamed V, Place of United Nations, Boulevard of Paris, Driss Lahrizi Street or the Boulevard of Rachid Boudani are the addresses of the exceptional architecture.

2- Villa des arts

Dedicated to the contemporary art, the villa of Arts exhibits several Moroccan artists but also welcomes international talents. This beautiful « art deco » white edifice, which is surrounded by a delightful garden belongs to the ONA foundation and rely on the funds of 800 donation.

3- Elise Villa

Behind the Beaux-Arts School of Casablanca, two architectural treasures are nested. Among them, The Elise Villa, which is an exceptional hotel constructed in 1910 then re-stored in 1930. Its beauty is controversial for the experts in the 20th century patrimony. Inside this villa, Le Rouget de L'Isle is considered as one of the best gourmet restaurants of the city, as well as of the country.

4- Church of Sacré-Cœur



Built in 1930 by the architect Paul Tournon, who holds the prize of Roma, the Church's style combining gothic and Art deco aesthetic, and stands very close to the Arab League Parc. Today desecralized, this old catholic sanctuary occasionally hosts cultural exhibitions and events.

5- The Central Market

In Casablanca's Central Market, it is the celebration of the senses! You are visiting the city, the place is one of the "must-see" addresses. Built in 1919 according to the basis blueprints of the architect Pierre Bousquet, who is one of the pillars of Casablanca's architecture.

6- La Bodega

This convivial restaurant is highlighted by the Hispanic vibe, that is slightly folkloric. For the menu: Tapas, burritos and other enchiladas, enjoyed with subdued lights and colorful noise. You can enjoy a cocktail while watching at the huge screen football games or Spanish documentaries...In the basement, three rooms plunges you in the cantina vibe.

7- The Dolphin Tavern

Craving some fish or some seafood? Visit the Dolphin tavern. You can savor a skilled mixture of Moroccan and Spanish cuisine. Generous and delicious fish frying, the kitchen is familial and homelike, as well as their clients. In the terrace, you can enjoy the elegant array of palms that border the place, while inside the room convivial tables. An amazing address that has been maintained by the same family since the 40s.

8- Petit Poucet

A historical French brewery where the menu varies: traditional salads and rib steak, liver, Kfta with french-fries, but also tasty Moroccan tajines and an exceptional quality of service. Saint-Exupéry and Marcel Cerdan used to frequently visit the place. Hence, a wall displaying notes and photos is honoring the days of the writer/aviator person on writing his correspondence.

9- IMCAMA

During your journey in sightseeing the historical center of Casablanca, do not forget to stop at the Imcama building. Acknowledged for its solid presence and its trapezoid facade, it was constructed in 1828 by Albert Grestin. While embellishing the road, it conforms to the architectural codes of the revisited Art deco plus the traditional Moroccan art. Whether on the windows' frames or the angle, the zelliges designs are very apparent. By additionally intriguing your curiosity, you can discover the staircase inside, the walls and the floors made by forged steel, granite and marble.

10- Menson Asador

Menson Asador is the Argentinian passion, served on a plate! Created by the Chef Simo, who is the winner of MasterChef Morocco, the restaurant opted for an Argentinian specialty, declined in a savory menu that invites to the amazing digestion. To intrigue your appetite, the signature dish of the restaurant is the Italian cheese Proviola barbecue, with a savory fillet of olive oil and oregano...

11- Mohammed V Place

Busy during the day and the night, the Place of the pigeons and its fountain are still the number one touristic site and the most photographed place of the economic capital. For many people, it is the best representation of the immortal Casablanca, the one that conserves for a century the same appeal.

12- Wilaya

A strong reference point for the people of Casablanca with its exceptional style and its refined architecture, the Wilaya generates admiration. Thanks to its dark clock tower inspired by the Tuscany, it is easy to trace the Wilaya from faraway. This magnificent edifice was built by the architect Marius Boyer, from 1927 to 1937.

13- Court of first instance

A real architectural treasure built during the 20s, its style combination with the stunning results. Even though is a court of law, yet you can freely visit it! From the gallery, to the ground level, an overview of Mohammed V place is offered. External corridors form a green patio with maintained palms trees.

14 - The Grand Post Office of Barid Al Maghrib

Built at the beginning of the 20th century, the Grand Post Office of Morocco is a mix of subtle orient and occidental. We notice the beautiful facade that is ornamented with deep blue and green zelliges, combining the geometric and floral ornamentation of this well-preserved edifice. Behind the marked corners, we can admire the gorgeous yellow clock that is distinguished by its unique topography.

15- Bank of Morocco - Bank Al Maghrib

Facing the Wilaya and in the center of the Mohammed V Place, this building was built by Marius Boyer. The edifice's facade is prettily punctuated by the geometric motifs. We also notice its elegant door made by copper. Inside, we can contemplate the zelliges ornamenting a wall section that holds the golden clock. A "Caesar sculpture" made by interlocked metals in 1989, the "Eiffel plaque" exposed in the main ward.

16- Building liberté

The apartment building « Liberté » is not far away from the famous "Le Maigre du Breuil" place and represents an architectural patrimony of Casablanca in the 50s. Located in the boulevard of « liberté », the building was constructed between 1949 and 1951 by Léonard Morandi. The first African building to exceed 16 floors at the time, it was quickly renamed by the people of Casablanca "17th floor" | 17ème Etage"

17- Paul villa Zevaco

Drinking coffee in an unusual place makes here sense. Also known under the name of Villa Sami Suissa "Butterfly villa", or "Villa Pagode", this venue that was first the simple dream of both Sami Suissa and the person who later became its project manager, Jean-François Zevaco, holds today a restaurant/coffee shop of Paul. The place is staple in order to gather with friends, have a professional lunch with clients or to enjoy the big sunny terrace.

18- Maret

Designed by Joseph Delaport in 1932, this 6 levels apartment building combines neoclassic and new art styles. The rotunda angle is the starting point of a series of curves that spread all over the main façade all along the impasse. The 6th floor, commercial gallery, highlights the spectacular decoration of the inferior floor that is paved with turquoise polychrome zelliges, evoking Gaudi's architecture.

19- la Princiére

A treasure that stands at 55 Driss Lahrizi street. The apartment building "La Princiére", is the gem of the 20s, and was constructed by the architect Alexander Cormier. Its somber corridor that sink into the innards of the building, lead to the 1st floor, to the "Antic Café". A cozy café with beautiful woodwork and ancient mirrors: An ideal address in order to sip a "lusciousN (Hot coffee, half milk)" far from the hectic rhythm of the white city.

CASA GREEN SPACES

20- Arab League Park



Hard to miss the long trees and the luxurious vegetation of the Arab League park that provides a much-needed fresh air to the people of Casablanca. A paradise for the sports fans during the mornings and weekends, it's also the perfect spot in the historical "Centre-Ville" 10 minutes far from the Médina and the United Nation Place. A real aesthetic transition from the Art deco city to the modern one.

21- Issesco Park

Paradise of the residents of Habous or the Mers Sultan neighborhood, the 4-hectare park that used to be called Murdoch Garden was created in 1917 honoring the eponymous British merchant. Constantly pampered by its gardeners, it is a flourishing oasis as well as a place of communion for the citizen and nature. Its charm originates from its surprising diversity: imposing stature of its palm trees, their flawless alignment from the main alley, and several other less dominant vegetal varieties.

22- Bouskoura Forest

With a surface of 3000 hectares, the Bouskoura forest is identifiable with its gigantic eucalyptus, noticeable from the sky. The place welcomes families, athletes, nature lovers and change of scenery seekers. It is the ground for numerous outdoor activities. The environment is favorable for picnics, hiking, cycling, and other outdoor activities.

23- Hermitage park

With an 18 hectares area, the Hermitage park is considered to be a huge place for strolls as well as a precious patrimony of the Metropolis. Located between Annual boulevard and Modibo Keita, it is the horticultural garden of the city. After its rehabilitation in 2011, it is currently proposing a delightful diversity of trees and flowers, in its corners filled of sun and shade.

24- Casamouja by Wecasablanca

Do you feel like taking an artistic stroll? El Hank neighborhood is the place to rush to! A real aesthetic virtuosity, the urban art collection of Casablanca was broadened by new projects achieved by local and international urban artists who were given a free run for interpretation, a pleasure for the spirit and the eye. 25-Museum of the Andalusian Music

Der Al Ala is a dedicated place for the Andalusian music. Located in the Habbous neighborhood, in a restored old Riad, the museum has three small rooms devoted to instruments, scores, and photos that have paved the history of this music genre. Der Al Ala is a "must-see" address if you like to travel in the history of the music and wander through authentic and well-preserved instruments.

26- Judaism Museum

This museum is established in an ancient Jewish orphanage, that was operating until 1910, then rehabilitated in 1997. Two areas are open to the visitors. The first one is dedicated to temporary exhibitions while the second for permanent exhibitions, regrouping Moroccan Jewish cult objects: lamps, jewelry, books, costumes, traditional clothes as well as rooms where a bedroom, a jewelry workshop were reconstituted.

27- Abderrahman Slaoui Museum

In the museum holds the name of a business man, great traveler and an art collector, who passed away in 2001. Open to visitors from May 2012 in a house dating from the 40s, and in the heart of the historical neighborhood of Casablanca, the museum permanently exposes old posters, old Moroccan jewelry, paintings of Moroccan artists, crystal objects, and the famous curiosity cabinet of the late Abderrahman Slaoui.

28- Studio des Arts Vivants

CASA HABOUS

31- Habous

Famous for its alleys, small places, fountains, arcades and stone-made doors, its mosque, traditional public baths, Kissariates (small shops), Habous neighborhood is especially known for its architectural style that goes along the criteria for an authentic ancient Médina, which makes it a unique example as for the architectural aspect. In this spectacular maze, do not forget to visit the various shops dedicated for spices and olives.

32- Zayna

Established in an 80 years old house and located in front of the Habous garden, the Zayna restaurant hold the local values of a Moroccan cuisine and offers a mix variety of traditional dishes: Tajines, Couscous, Rissas, Tanja, Marrakchia, Boulefare... Zayna was also frequented by many Hollywood celebrities filming in the Habous neighborhood, such as the Tom Cruise troupe during the shooting of Mission Impossible 5.

33- Imperial Café

34- Mahkama of the Pacha



Located in the heart of the Habous neighborhood, the Mahkama du Pacha is an amazing architecture. A living witness of the traditional Moroccan arts, the building was built by August Cadet and is now the headquarter of the Casablanca-Settat region. With its big court and its two main fountains-looking patios, it holds the beauty and appeal of the classical Moroccan aesthetic.

37- The old Médina

The médina is an agglomeration of neighborhoods and stacks of bazars and souks which when passing by "Bab Marrakech", the old structure that stands and narrates history. It is located within the city center, the historical place where Casablanca as a city started developing. A major location in the list of Casablanca's sites, where you can buy souvenirs or do your grocery shopping: new and trendy clothes, traditional, leather products, pottery...

38- Excelsior

The Excelsior hotel is the masterpiece of the architect Joseph Delaporte at the start of the 20th century, another witness of the ancient era. While facing the big entrance door of the Médina, the hotel stands out with its yellow and white facade. With the opening of its brewery during the last decades, the place became one of the most popular venues of Casablanca. The hotel was also one of the most frequented locations by the European business men living in Casablanca, a famous guest to mention: Antoine de Saint-Exupéry, 2, *Brahim El Amraoui street - ex Nelly, Centre-Ville I +212 5 22 60 12 26*

39-Ecological stroll in the medina

Bike riding is another alternative to discover and stroll the Médina of Casablanca. Vélo Casa Médina offers a guided visit of an hour and a half while riding bicycles through the alleyways of the old and historical location.

40- Bab Marrakech

Stalls, colorful pyramids of spices, food market as well as ready to wear stores, the Médina offers a large choice and selection of products in a one-of-a-kind atmosphere. Bab Marrakech is the name given to one of the 7 stone-made doors that gives access to the old city "Médina". Recently, an African market by the name of "Little Dakar" was created there several sub-Saharan products.

41- Buenaventura Church

Hidden behind the walls of the old Médina of Casablanca, the Buenaventura church is the symbol of brotherhood and good vicinity. Its existence was almost forgotten by the city's citizens until the day of its inauguration as a culture house. After being the residence area of the French, and welcoming Spanish descendants' parishioners, the church is today a culture venue.

42- The Sqala

Perfectly localized, behind the ramparts of the 19th century and adjoining the ancient Médina, the Sqala is the refinement of the Moroccan cuisine. You can eat quickly, if desired, however, delicious dishes are guaranteed and affordable prices. It is a culturally animated restaurant where you can assist to an Andalusian music shows in its garden or a popular music recital... The old city's soul, the Moorish town revived.

43- Rick's Café

If "Casablanca" movie was shot in Hollywood, the passionate and intelligent entrepreneurs have recreated one of the most important frames of the city: The Rick's Café. In the muffled atmosphere that was inspired from Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman scenes, you can enjoy the delicious specialties of the restaurants. The place is frequently visited by renowned music stars.

44- United Nations Place

Exactly located in the city center, the United Nations Place is an iconic Art deco location. After its renewal in 2010, the place is now more appealing and enjoyable. Animated during the night, it is the venue where social mixture occurs and where American fast-foods are aligned next to the France Café, on the ground floor of the building constructed during the 20s.

This place is the central nerve of Casablanca, also called the Chinatown of Casablanca, where many dishes are offered. You can almost find everything: Food, furniture, fabrics, Caftan fabrics, ready-to-wear as well as fabrics for curtains and Moroccan living rooms and material for birthday parties. Somewhere in between the past and the present which eventually created an amazing atmosphere. Prices vary, however, most of the merchandise's prices are affordable.

46- Morocco Mall

Innovative, completed and modern, it is the biggest retailtainment mall in Africa. Founded in December 2011, the Mall is established on a surface of 250 000 m² and hosts over 300 brands. The gigantic shopping center contains an aquarium, a musical fountain, an ice-skating ring, and a theme park for kids.

49- Solidarity market

The Solidary Market of Casablanca was established by the Mohammed V solidarity association. It is facing the Oasis railway station. In its two floors, the market offers a wide variety of local products, prickly pear oil, carob honey, argan oil, dates, date syrup, Khâl, orange flower water, Saffron...everything! First Market of its kind in Morocco, this place is also an exposition venue for the Moroccan Craftsman, you can find carpets, fabrics, pottery, Oasis road, in front of the O'asis train station I Every day 10:00 am to 06:00 pm.

50- Anfa Hill

The colline d'Anfa is the ideal place to refresh your mind and take a fresh break! Famous for hosting in what used to be the Anfa Hotel the very renowned Anfa conference, that had reunited Churchill, Roosevelt, and the general de Gaul in order to plan strategies along them, just before the beginning of the 2nd world war. Today, the area is exclusively reserved to residences, and is called the White City's Beverly Hills.

51- Round Villa

The round villa is one of the most known villa of the city. The citizens also call it the Camembert Villa for its unique cylindric shape. Built in 1963 by Wolfgang Ewerth, its original roman-like name is "Villa of Dr. B". The round futuristic design of the building, standing over stilts, as well as the secretive and mysterious behavior of its owner makes it look like a movie scene. The Villa welcomes today temporary exhibitions.

52- Tachfine Center

The Tachfine Center is a shopping center located very close to the railway station CasaVoyageurs. With a surface of 19 000 m², it offers a variety selection of food, kids activities with its Fun Park, and at least 70 brands which most of them are specialized in fashion and beauty.

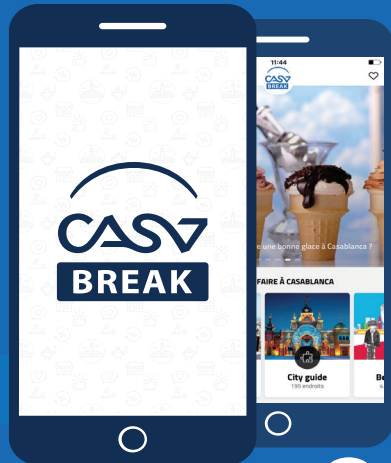

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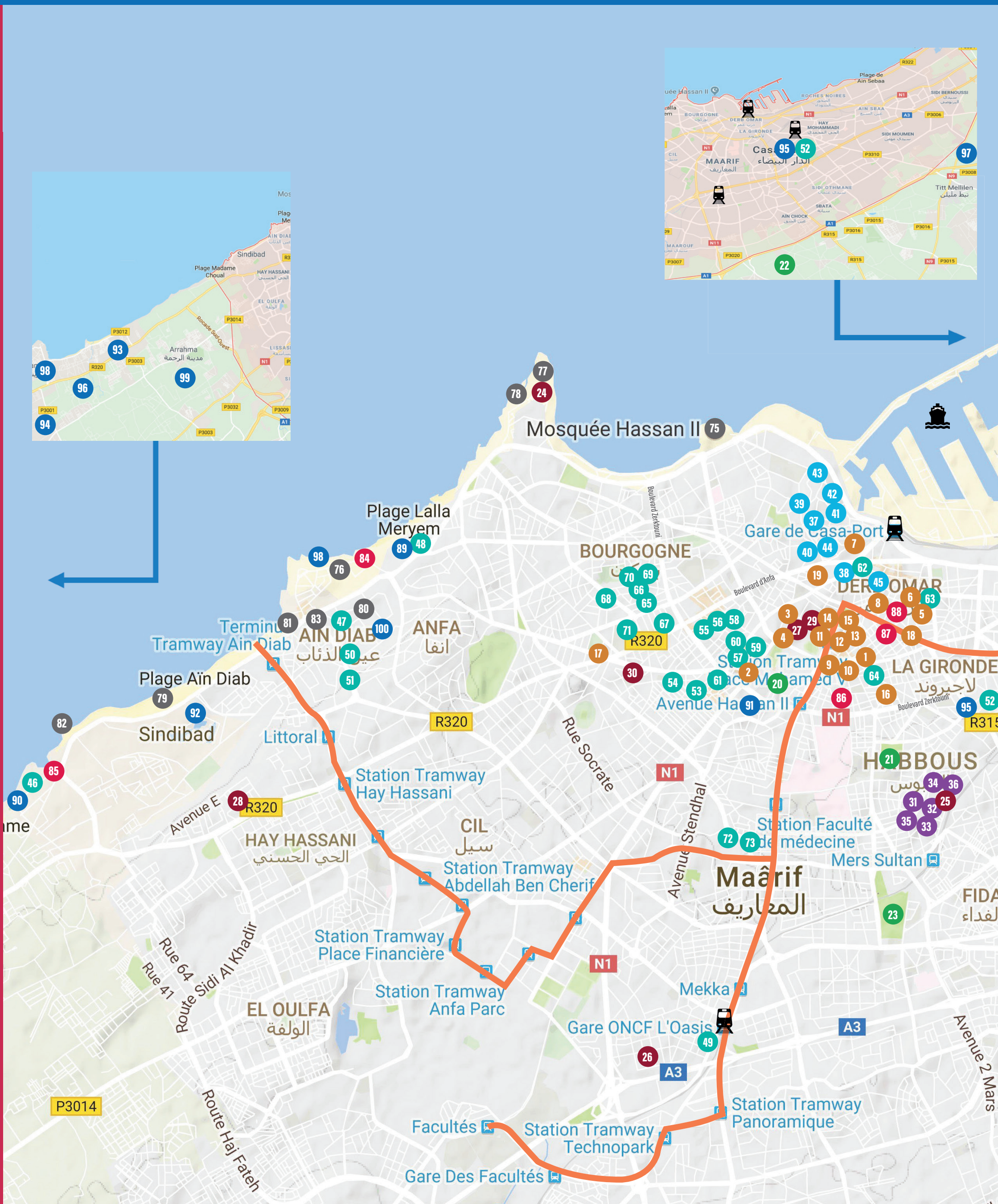
